Human Rights Dashboard

Introduction and Context

Nigeria faces multiples challenges in the protection and enjoyment of human rights for the citizens.

Insecurity expressed in terrorism, banditry, kidnapping and other activities of non-state actors have posed challenges to the enjoyment of human rights across Nigeria.

Economic, fiscal and monetary reforms introduced by the new administration have increased socio-economic inequalities

Nigeria continue to battle with multi-dimensional poverty impacting on the enjoyment of human rights

Mandate

- The NHRC is primarily charged with the promotion and protection of human rights in Nigeria.
- The NHRC Act of 2010 mandates the Commission to:
 - Publish and submit, from time to time, to the president, national assembly, judiciary, state and local governments, reports on the state of human rights promotion and protection in Nigeria;
 - Maintain a library, collect data and disseminate information and materials on human rights generally;
 - Promote an understanding of public discussions of human rights issues in Nigeria

Human Rights Dashboard and Observatory

NHRC in exercise of its mandate is establishing a Human Rights Dashboard and Observatory

Human Rights Dashboard:

A monthly Analysis and graphical presentation of human rights situation in Nigeria.

Human Rights Observatory:

Monitoring, Reporting and Analysis of human rights violation across Nigeria.

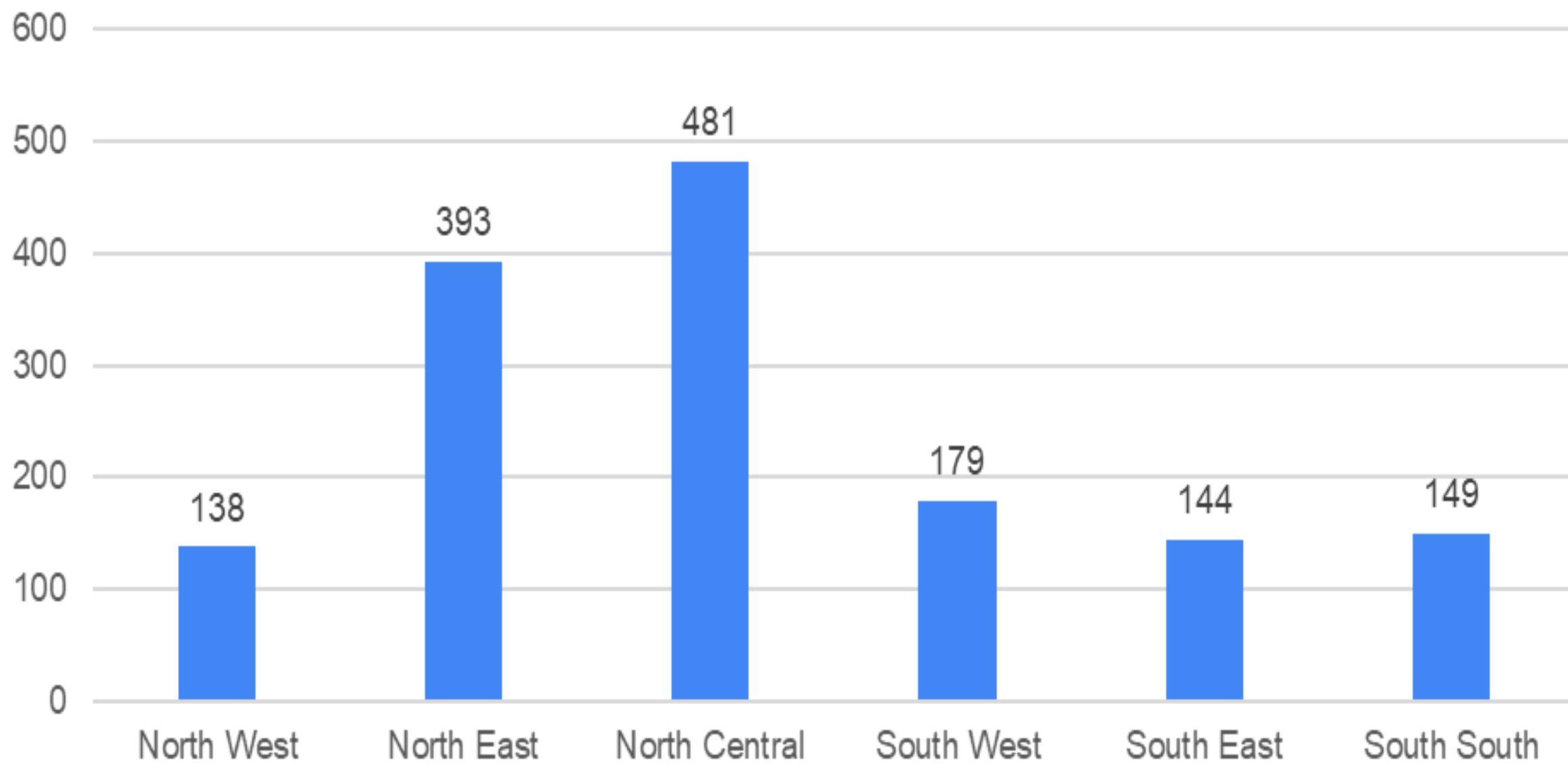

NHRC February 2024 Human Rights Complaints

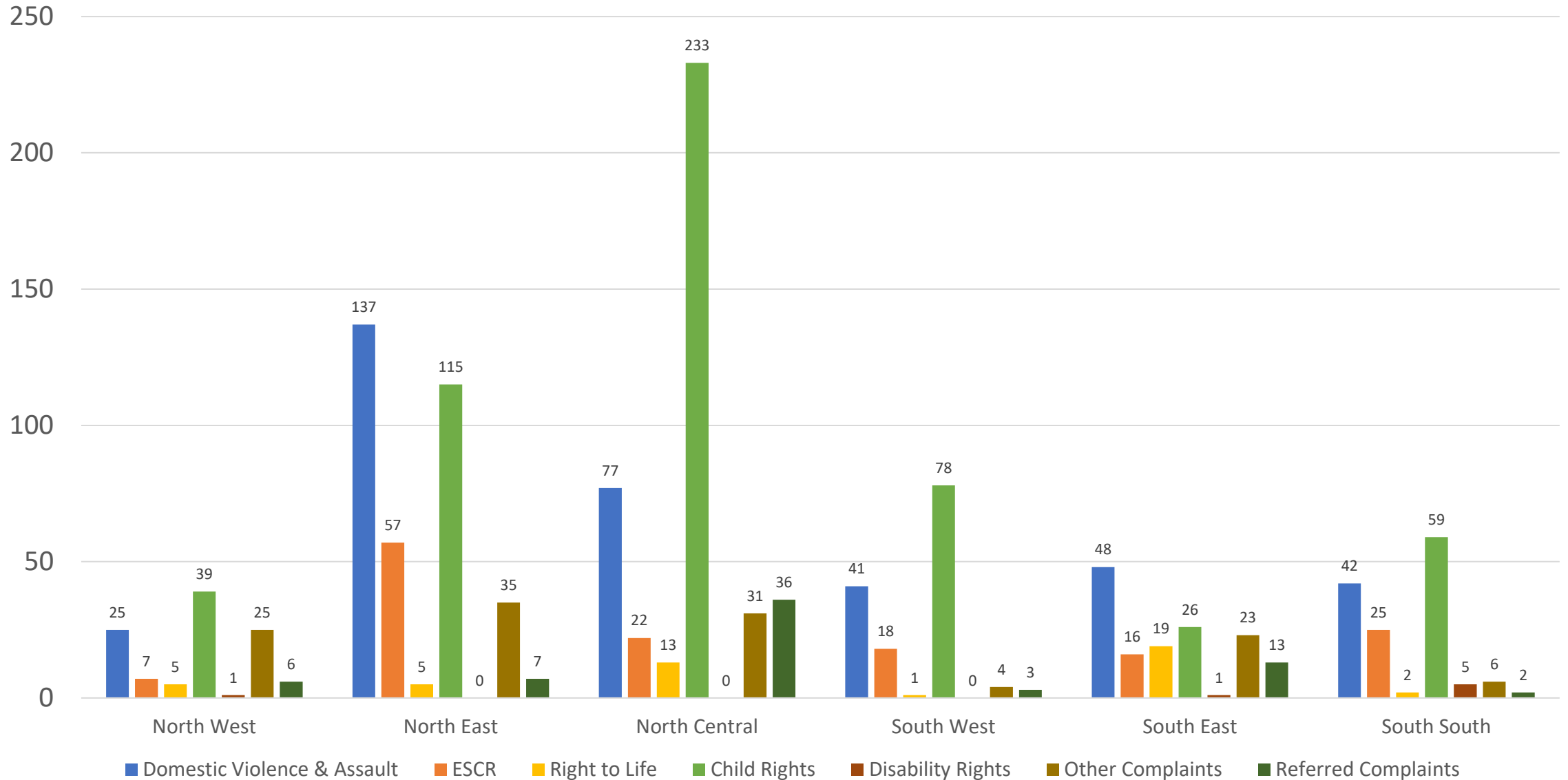
- Total Number of Complaints: **1484**
 - Against State Actors - 95
 - Domestic Violence – 370
 - Violation of Children's' Rights - 550
 - Against Non-State Actors - 28
 - Against Private Sector Actors - 53
 - ESCR - 145
 - Right to life – 45
 - Persons with disabilities - 7
 - Others - 189

Note that for February 2024, NHRC has added additional main data set to violation of the rights of children and for the violation of the rights of persons with disabilities.

February 2024 Complainst Across Geo-Political Zones

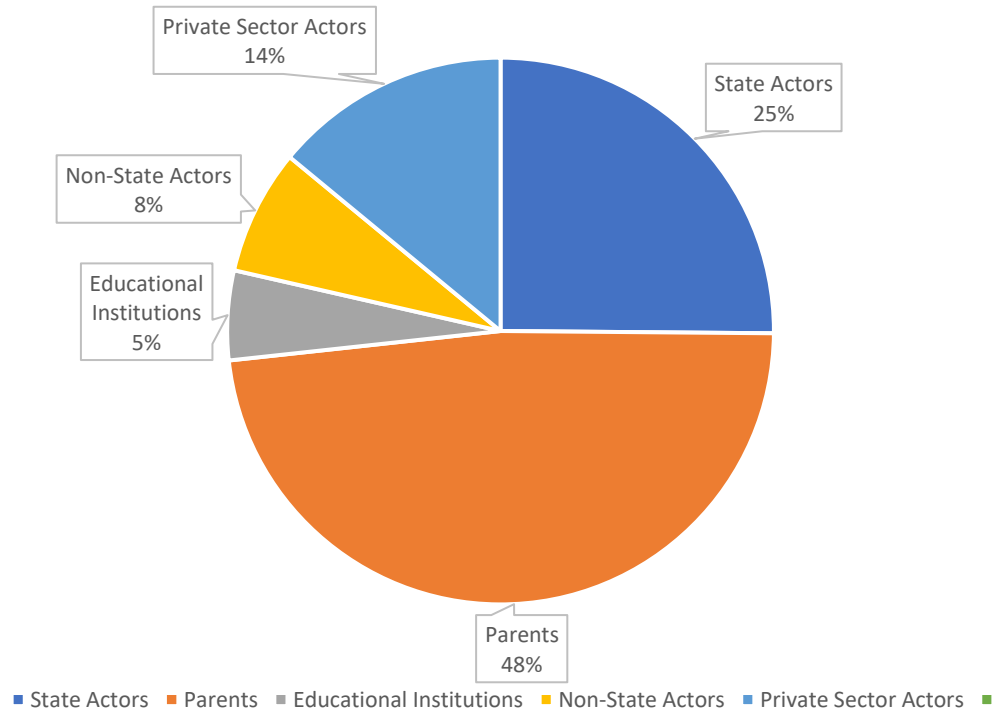


Thematic Complaints Across Geopolitical Zones

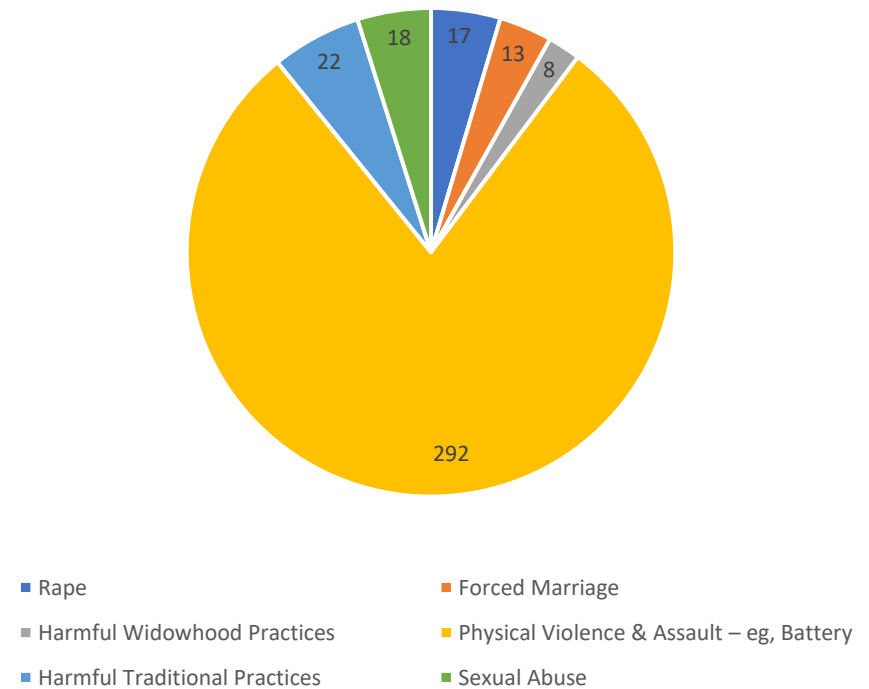

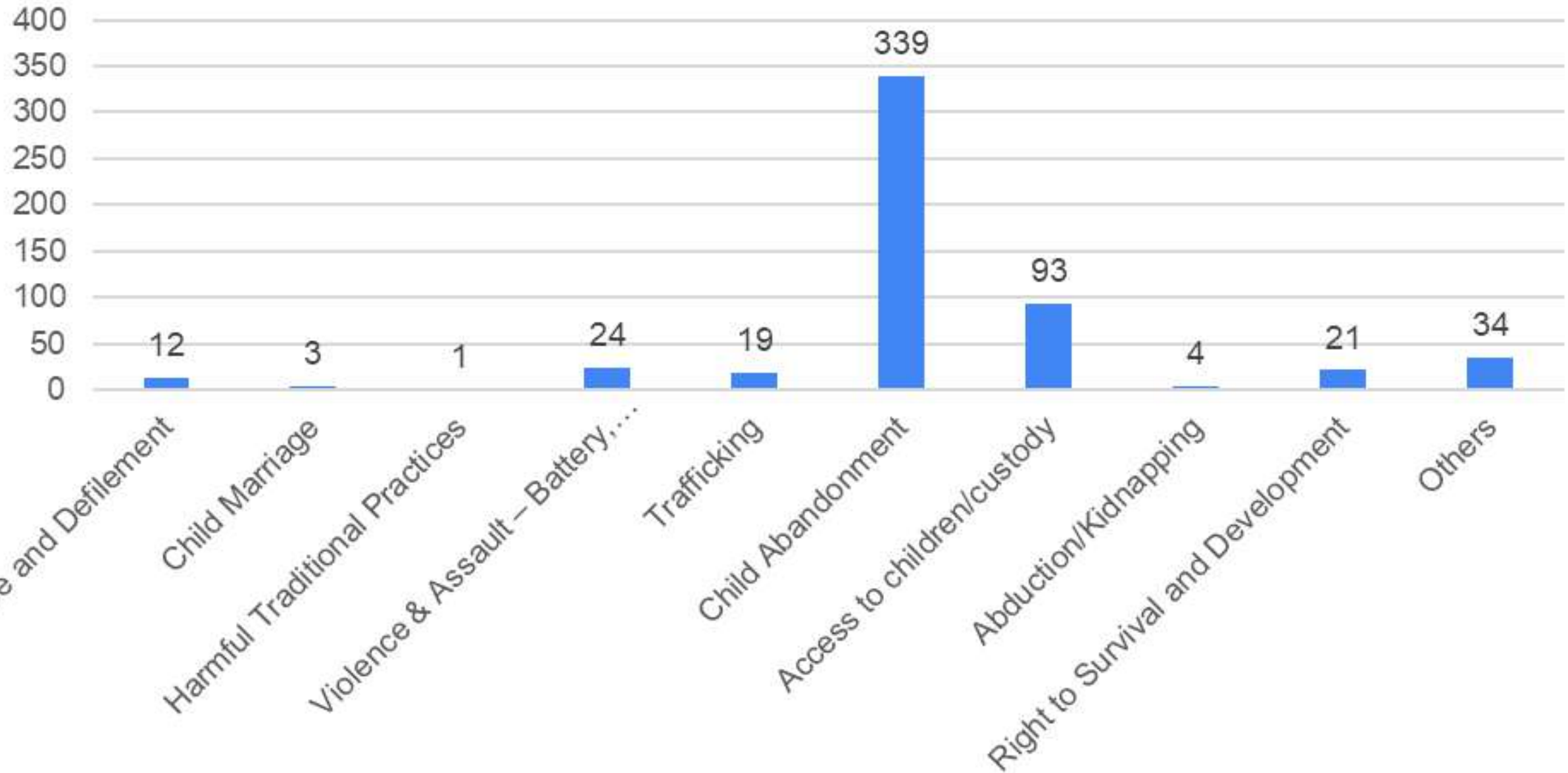
February 2024 Main Violators of Human Rights

Labor rights, Education, Health

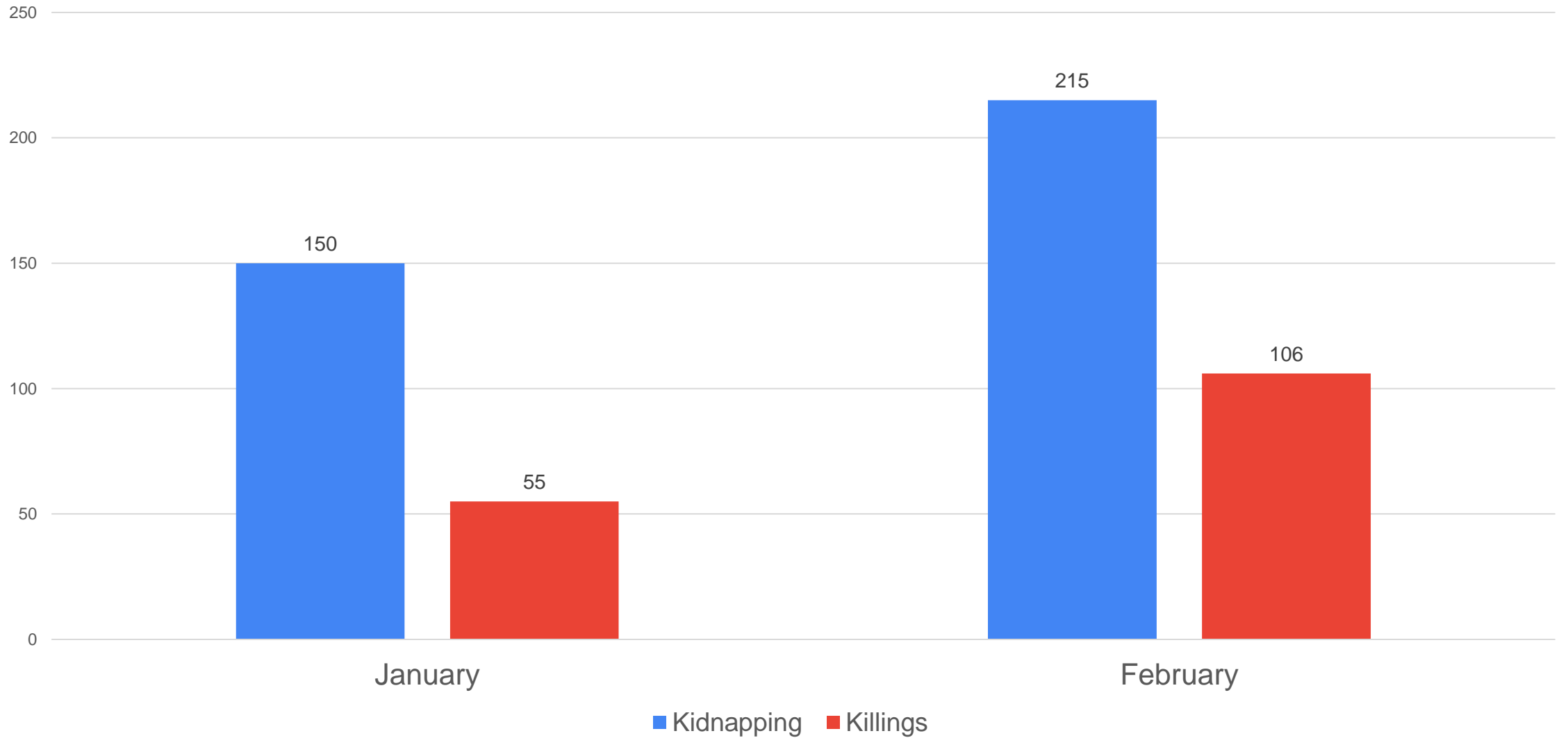
Non-State Actors

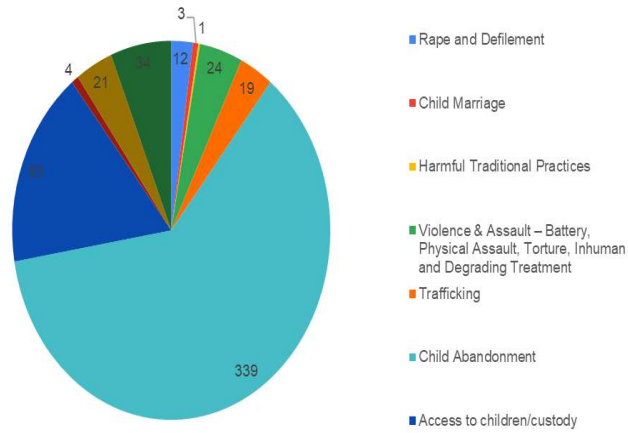

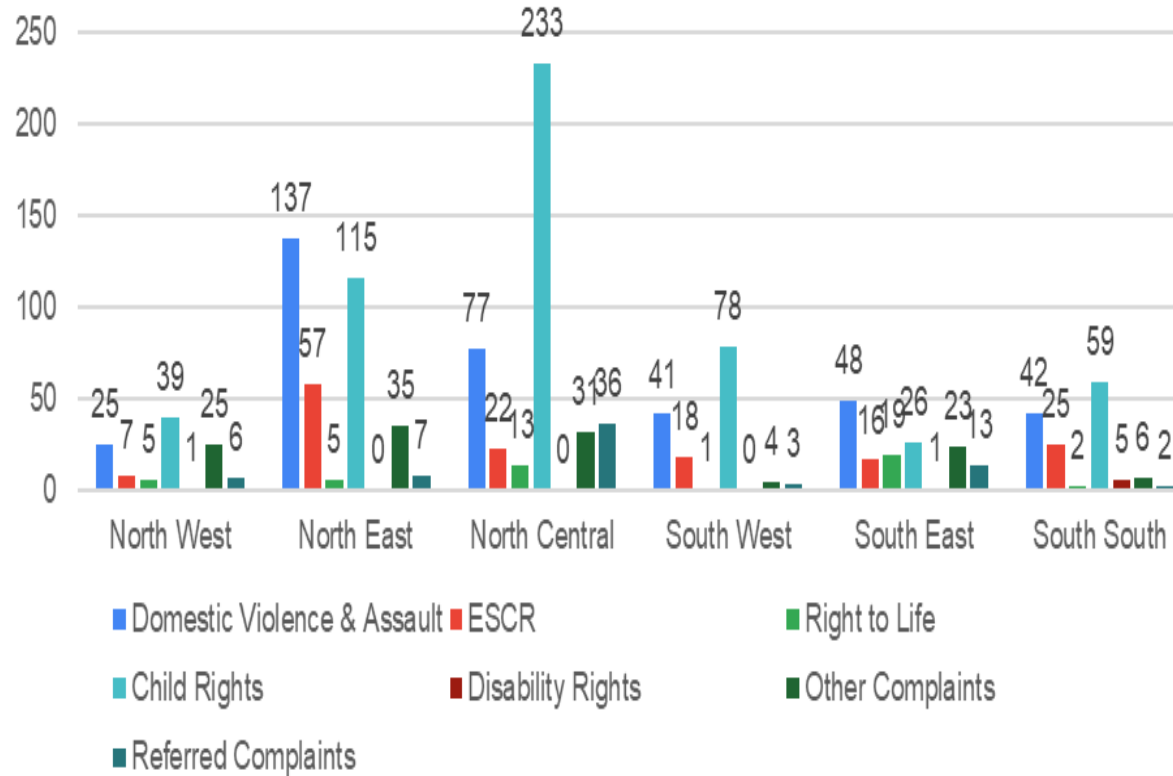

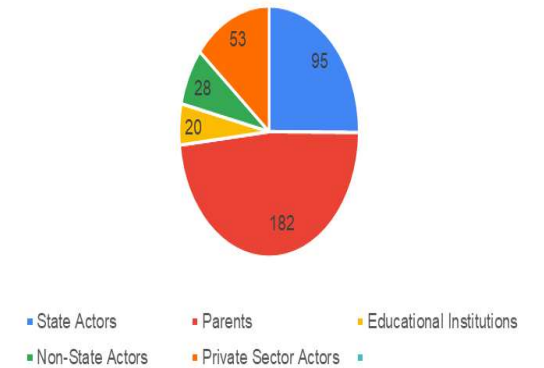

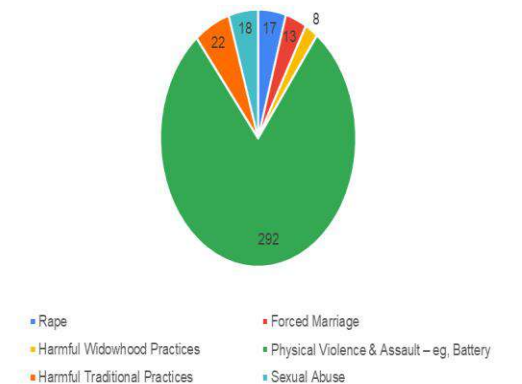
Thematic Complaints Accross Geopolitical Zones



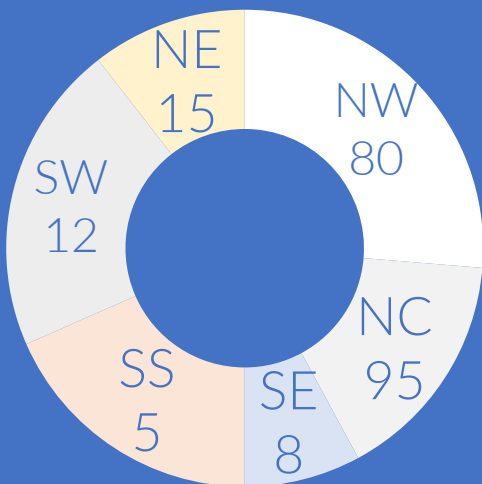
February 2024 Main Violators of Human Rights
