General Human Rights Situation


- Human rights complaints to the NHRC continue to witness astronomical rise






September 2024 Complaints Across Geo-Political Zones








Top 5 States: Killings in September 2024




Killings & Kidnapping (September 2024)




Complaints Investigation

- 5(b) monitor and investigate all alleged cases of human rights violations in Nigeria and make appropriate recommendations to the Federal Government for the prosecution and such other actions as it may deem expedient in each circumstance.
- 5(j) receive and investigate complaints concerning violations of human rights and make appropriate determination as may be deemed necessary in each circumstance.
- 6(1)(a) conduct its investigations and inquiries in such manner as it considers appropriate.

Top 10 States: September 2024 Resolved Human Rights Cases






NHRC Visit to Katsina Correctional Centre

- Mob Action:
 - FCT: Burning of an alleged motorcycle thief.
 - FCT: Man beaten for allegedly stealing a bag of rice
 - EDO: Killing an alleged murder
